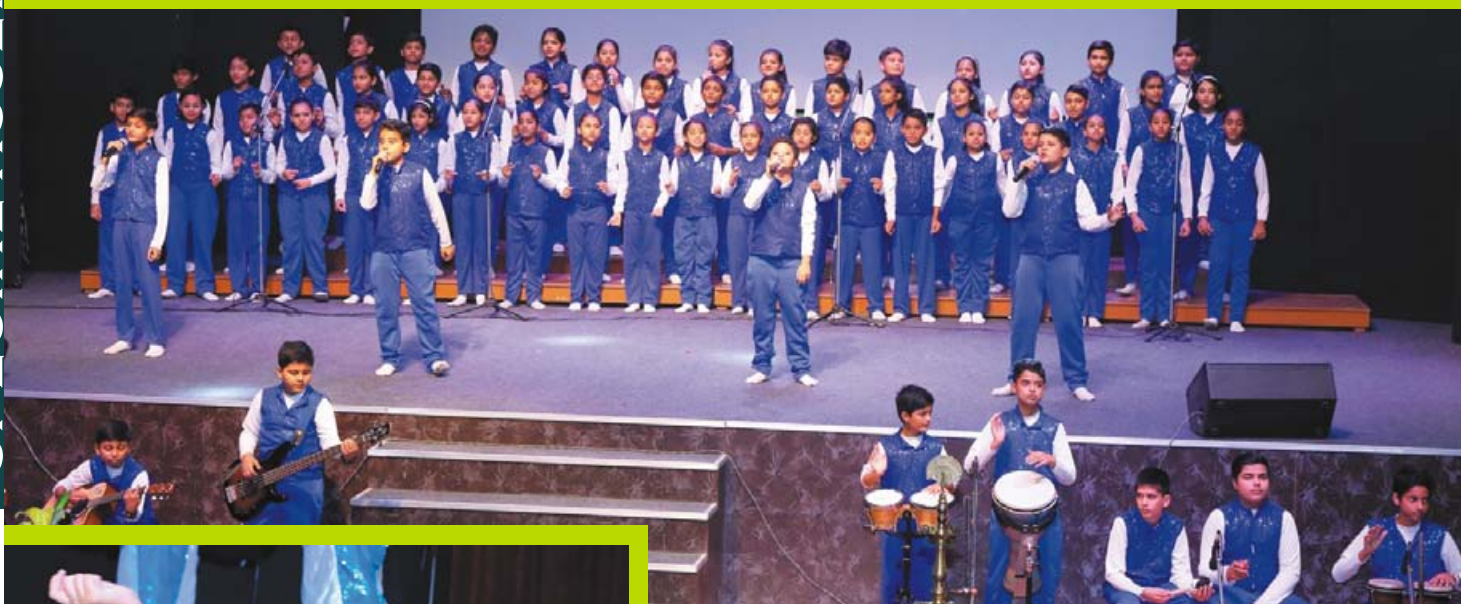

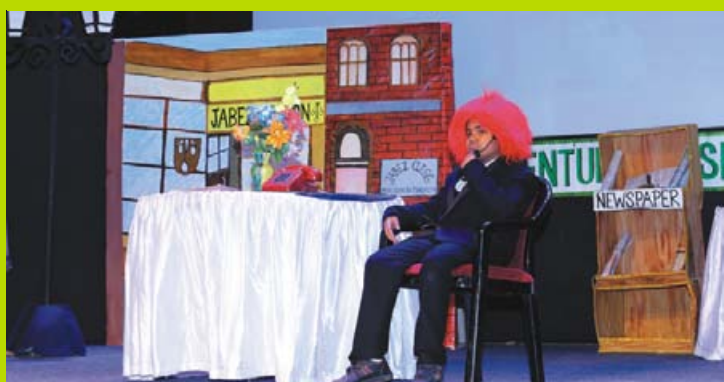

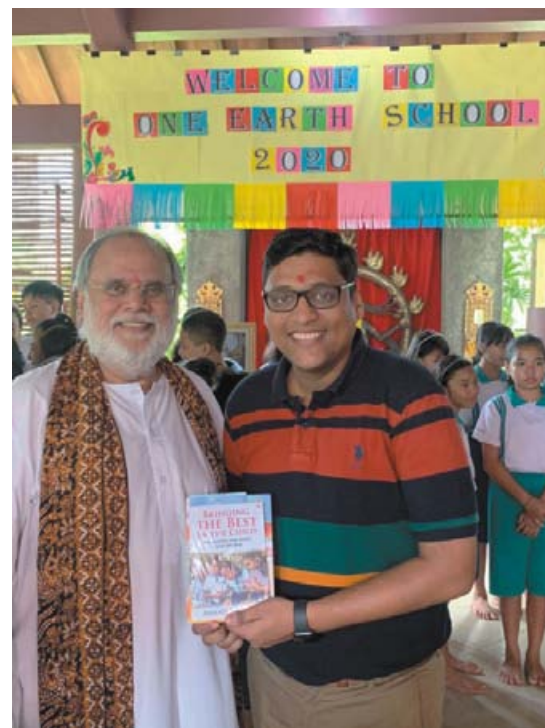


BALI EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE PROGRAM

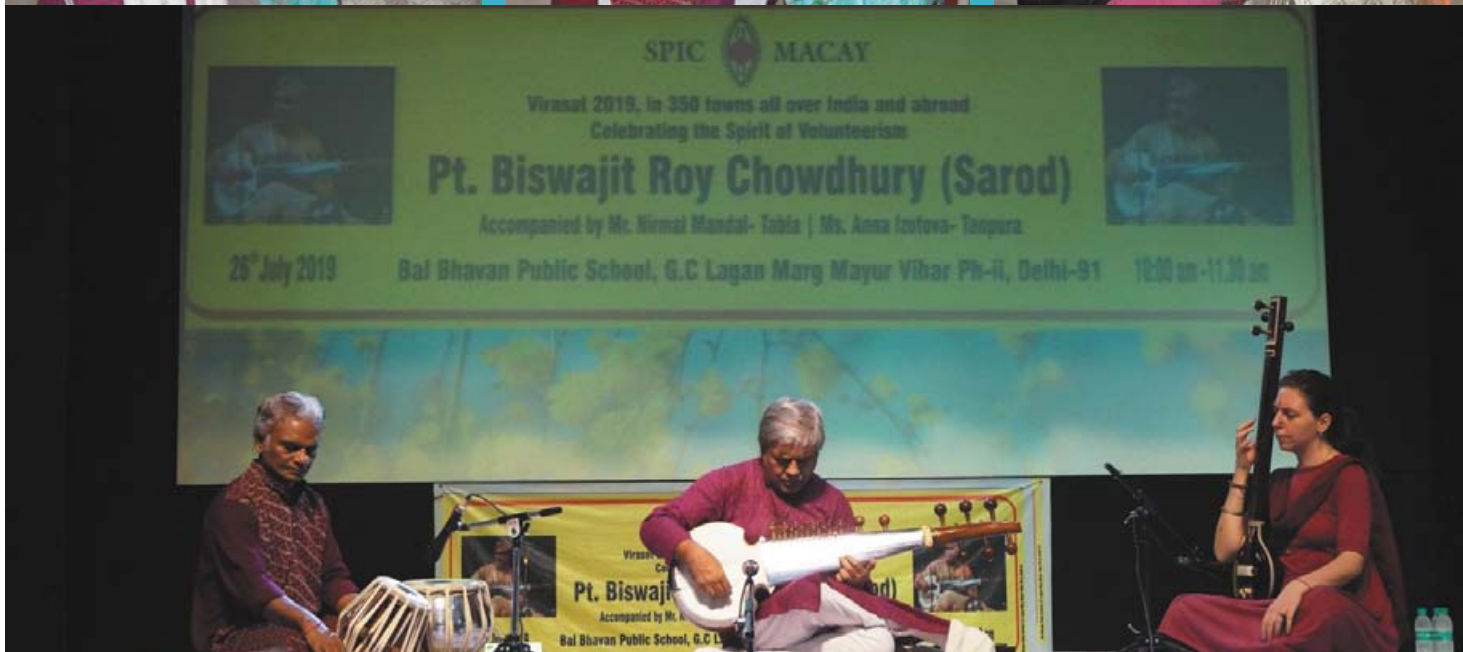

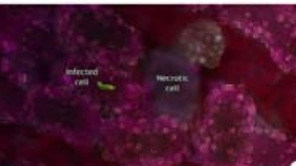

WORKSHOP ON TOBACCO AWARENESS

The youngsters these days are attracted to all sort of things offered in this world which they consider to be a cool statement however it is our prime duty to guide them in a admissible direction and aware and sensitize them about the follies in the negative things they are attracted to. Owing to the concern the school organized a workshop on tobacco awareness which intended to acquaint the students of class VI regarding its ill effects. The workshop was conducted by Dr. S. K. Arora, Additional Director Health, Govt. of Delhi



and a prestigious WHO award winner. He majorly covered areas concerning how smoking is injurious to health. Pictures, posters and cartoons depicting the harmful effects of smoking were displayed to highlight the miserable plight of tobacco addicts. It gave an illuminating discourse on the diseases caused by tobacco consumption, measures taken by the government to check the menace and the proposed ban on films

The need for creating awareness, especially amongst the youth and the harmful effects of tobacco products, were the other aspects discussed during the workshop. He expressed concern over the increasing addiction to tobacco in the present day youth, particularly in rural areas. He said there is a need to inculcate moral



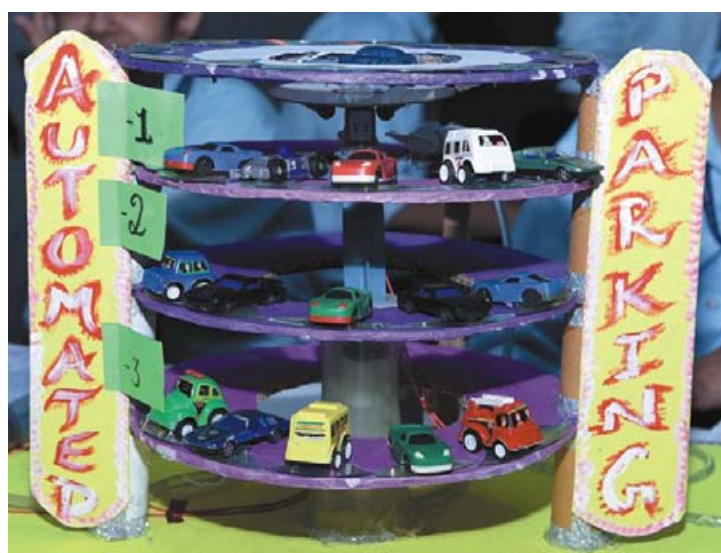
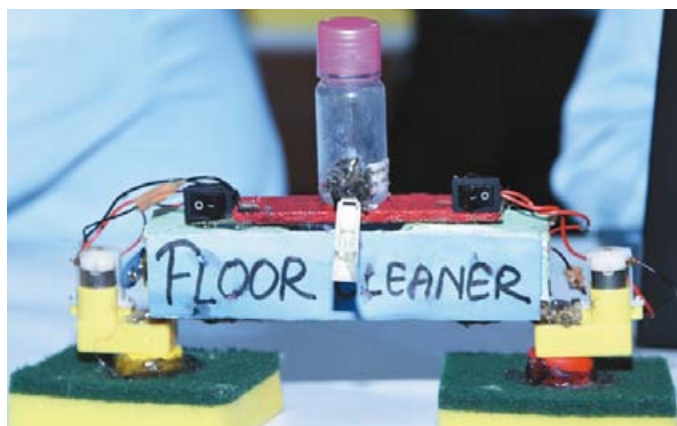
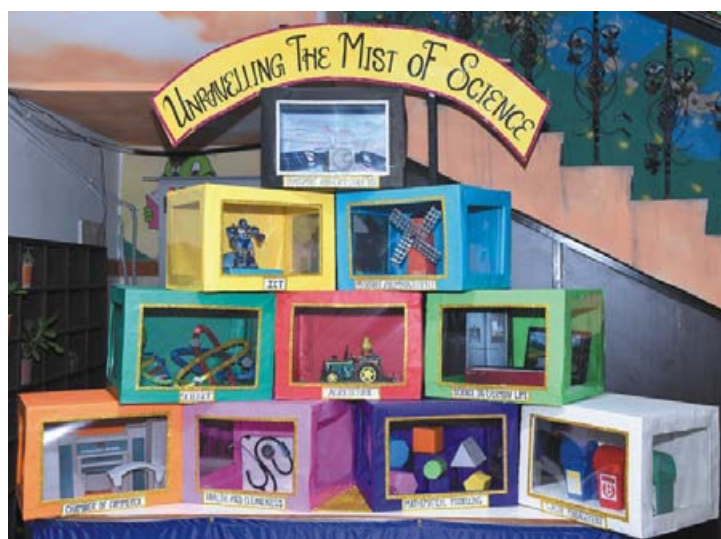
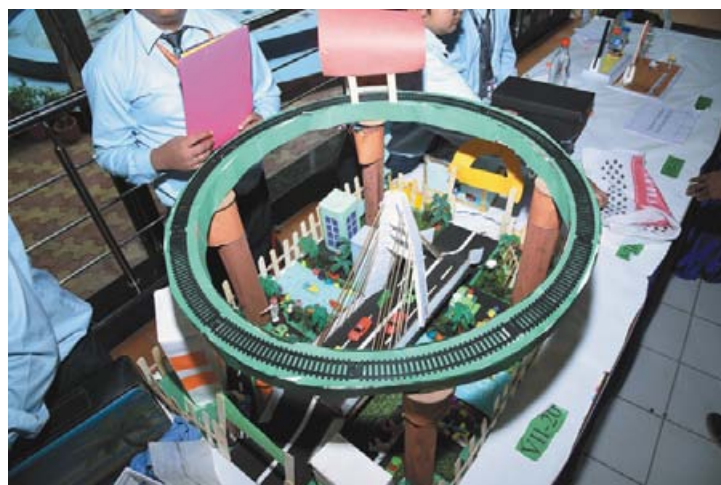

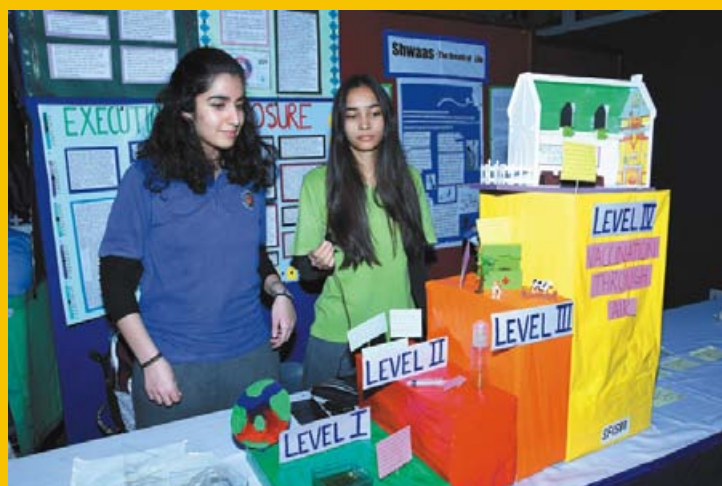
REGIONAL SCIENCE EXHIBITION

Growing death rates due to excessive usage of social media was yet another concern in the workshop. The workshop left students realize the safety tricks and possible precautions which they must take in order to protect themselves from hazards of technology.
